- Henry David Thoreau, Civil Disobedience


Yes, and so the MacLaren Art Centre, for one large, ongoing City grant recipient, has some problems, and it has always carried with it, friends getting the gigs, who get the grants, who get to consult, who get their awards, and they keep it to themselves, and the City picks up the tab, and so on. And that is just one example. So let's condemn any government involvement in the arts as interference, as the Libertarians do, and rely on the perfection of the jungle, the marketplace, to reward hard work and genius, and ignore laziness and hacks, correct? That is the way I felt about it. Not now.

Libertarians? The Ontario leader for the past few elections, Allen Small, was an Ontario high school teacher for thirty years; his wife is a teacher and their kids are teachers. They all work for the government and pretend to hate it. The federal leader, Tim Moen, with a few months before the election, is both absent and silent. It is a party of jokers and cranks, who never donated a dime to my campaigns, and only one person, from Toronto, ever volunteered for me, when I ran for that party. What

they believe in makes sense...for the most part. Of the parts that do not make sense, I am distancing myself from them, and one of those beliefs is that the government has no business taking part, in the arts.

While I still believe in frugality and as much fairness as possible if the government is running something, if you look back on what the markeplace celebrates and ignores, it doesn't always do a good job. If that imperfection can be tolerated, then we might as well allow for the government to participate, too, imperfect as it is. As with the vaunted markeplace, sometimes, the government also gets it right.

When I was told by the local, legendary music dealer, Big John Ritson, that Stephen Mosley aka Mose Stephenson had passed away, I immediately felt that Mosley had been cheated by the world. My





second thought was that the City of Barrie's Creative Economy Department might be able to do something. And so off I went, asking for the Nanny State that I had complained about publicly for years, to make it all better. It did. It was an effort that I started, however, it was all Mosley's talent and the decades of work he had put in, which gave the effort to create an award for him, the moral right to happen, along with people in the creative, and the larger community, who also appreciated Mosley's contributions, and acted to support the idea that he should be officially recognized by the City he gave so much to, for so long.


Mosley never got a record deal, so he was never in the running for any awards. He had a stroke, which took away his ability to play the guitar and harmonica, then he got more sick, and died. No money, no fame and no recognition. Too bad, right? Wrong, thanks to the government, which worked with the community of creative people, to include him in last year's Arts Awards. That is the Award, in the middle of the page. The five albums and their release dates are along the bottom of the page.

Mosley performed for decades, with one of those decades being mostly lost to drug addiction. He began releasing his albums at the

> age of 55. People who pursue the arts often fall by the sidelines, and as others who are not pursuing creative paths, rise in business or just become more valuable at their regular jobs, artists, sometimes, get regarded by family and friends as idiots and losers if they are not making money. That is one of the reasons why the Barrie Arts Awards are so important, as they allow that stigma to be rebutted. One of those artists, Mosley, received an Award, albeit posthumously. Better late, than never.

Before, I had argued publicly against government involvement in the arts. Now, after the municipal government has done the right thing, beyond the Awards themselves, and played their part in rescuing the legacy of an exceptional, local artist, I have to do my part, and publicly disown the Libertarian idea, that government has no role to play in the arts.

Council murders The Charter and the City's motto, to play hitman for a heckling MP

It does not matter that the Integrity Commissioner used long and flowery language to make her decision against Ward 2 Councillor, Keenan Aylwin. She had junk to work with; a bad Code. To use computer "code" language, garbage in, garbage out. Whether the Commissioner had a bias or was just doing the best she could with the junk she had to work with, she was wrong. Council was just as wrong to accept the recommendation for a reprimand against Aylwin, because they were informed by myself with emails and letters delivered to them with copies I have stamped as received, that we have a Charter and a Libel and Slander Act, that every one of them had to knowingly ignore, in order to reprimand Aylwin. Everyone who voted for Aylwin and even those in his ward who did not vote for him, yet now stand with him, as I do, had their Charter rights violated by having their representative, reprimanded, with a Code not worth the paper it is printed on, used as a reason to diminish Aylwin's voice and terrorize him with the threat of more reprimands and possible loss of income, to speaking less, and second-guessing himself.

After having been reprimanded once, it makes it all the easier and faster to reprimand Aylwin again. The pity is, it was all for so little, the "footsie" comment. And now the little has vanished. It was all for nothing.

At about the same time Barrie–Innisfil MP John Brassard made his complaint to the City's Integrity Commissioner, he also filed a claim for defamation in Superior Court against Aylwin, which was active when the Commissioner made her recommendations, and right until the moment when Council voted to accept the recommendation to reprimand Aylwin, and, when they did reprimand Aylwin. That date was June 12, 2019. Less than a day later, during business hours the next day, Brassard withdrew his defamation claim. He had said that he felt strongly about the claim. He lied. That is why he withdrew the claim. If you feel "strongly" about a claim, then you finish it. You do not drop it, before the settlement conference. Brassard didn't really feel strongly about the claim, because he withdrew it, immediately after Aylwin was reprimanded. He never really cared, and the reason why he never really cared, was because even Brassard knew, it was not anything worth bringing to court. Aylwin could have called to witness anyone he needed, to make his defence, including Conservative Party Leader, Andrew Scheer.

It was all a cheap gamble, a roll of the dice costing no more than the price of the paper to file the complaint with the City, which then found its way to the same old



Barrie City Council fails to save lives


